WHAT'S THE ALBANIAN SKILLS WEEK 2021 ABOUT?

Albanian Skills Week took place from 24-29 May, 2021 for the 4th year, inspired by the European Vocational Skills Week. European Vocational Skills Week is a European Commission initiative to raise awareness about vocational education and training (VET) and increase its attractiveness since 2016. Inspired by this wonderful initiative which aims to make VET more appealing, to help young people and adults reach their full potential, Albanian Skills initiated the first Skills Week in Albania from 2018.

The fourth edition of the Albanian Skills Week was a hybrid event to ensure all COVID-19 safety measures. The organizers of this week had the pleasure and honor to hold the opening activity of the Albanian Skills Week 2021 in the City of Kukes, in the premises of the Vocational School, to continue the online sessions during the entire week, in the morning and evening sessions, an hybrid event in Korca with VET providers and Innovation Hub and two in person sessions in Tirana.

Under the motto: 'Skills for Green, Digital and Safe Life' during this entire week was introduced the importance of skills and how to challenge the technical transformation revolution. Every person should be equipped with the necessary skills to have a safer life in every aspect: at work, health, psychological, society, etc. given the COVID 19 situation.

What happened?

What will happen?

- The second group of 15 students from vocational schools is expected to travel to Poland during Autumn to complete one and three months internships there.
- New mobility calls are expected to open during these months, so follow us on our social networks and website to stay informed.
- Job Shadowing for 6 teachers in The Netherlands and France are expected to take place in October and November.

Second Summer School for teachers in Seville

From July 27th to the 30th 2021 in Seville, Spain took place the second Summer School organized by INCOMA in connection with the INTERVET Western Balkans project, where two Albanian staff members from the VET schools were selected to participate from an open call published during May 2021, Mr. Ferik Koci from Shkolla Profesionale "Kristo Isak" and Mr. Kristaq Kikli from Shkolla Profesionale "Beqir Cela". <u>INCOMA</u> is a training and research centre based in Seville with extensive know-how and experience in the development and coordination of international cooperation projects mainly funded within the framework of EU programmes, especially in the field of education, training and research.

Along with this five days summer school program the selected participants got to interact with VET staff from other Balkan countries as well as from other countries all over Europe.



AUGUST 2021, SUMMER PUBLICATION

Both the Albanian participants answered positively our invitation to write some feedback about their experience in Seville, Spain in the framework of the INTERVET WB Project because they consider students and staff mobilities very valuable experience helping them to become more agile, innovative and skillful for a better match of VET education with labour market needs.



Mr. Kikli is a teacher and at the same time a Chairman of Administration Council of Water Supply Enterprise in Durres, and he is very excited about this experience which be used in two ways: first one by encouraging his students to participate and be engaged in such international projects and secondly by trying to adapt these gained knowledge during his work with the students. He will suggest this project to his school colleagues because according to him, the benefits and the results of such participation were obvious and noticed in his colleagues from the EU countries he met in the summer school. He concludes his testimonial by the following message for all VET Teachers: "Let's try for the preparation of the best professionals for their future".

I felt honored to be part of this summer school and take pride to share with you the best impressions I have from my participation in the summer school, said Mr. Koci, the school director of Shkolla Profesionale "Kristo Isac".

He continues: it's come the time when knowledge and ideas must cross the borders of countries. It is precisely this message that was conveyed when getting to know the concrete methodology of how our students can become part of these international practices. That is why I have started to share the information received in this summer school with the staff and others either in formal meetings or informal ones in small groups.

By becoming part of these meetings they will have new approaches and models on how to implement internships for their students and consequently they will be more motivated in the searching for good learning opportunities for the students and motivating others to become part of the school.

First VET Student Mobility in Bologna

On June 25, the ten selected students from the VET schools in Albania traveled to Italy for one month mobility in the framework of the INTERVET WB project. This project is the first of its kind in Westerns Balkans Countries therefore it has a special importance for the VET system in Albania and other countries of the Western Balkans. For one month the students developed teaching practices in different companies in the city of Bologna where they had the opportunity to learn new things, hare experiences and create networks.



Immediately upon the arrival the students were accommodated on campus were introduced to the rules and procedures they had to follow. During their stay they had the opportunity to get to know each other as well as to socialize with students from other European countries living in the campus who were doing their mobility in Bologna. This way of living away from home, sharing shared spaces and organizing their living themselves gave these young people the opportunity to become more responsible, learn to live with others, and be more independent.





This first mobility consisted of a group of very enthusiastic and prepared students who received and offered very interesting experiences in the companies where they worked.



Second Transnational Meeting in Sarajevo

On June 28-29 2021, the 2nd transnational meeting of Intervet Western Balkans project took place at the International University of Sarajevo. Even the unwelcomed heatwave at the end of June did not prevent the participants from holding a very fruitful and constructive meeting. After one year and a half working online, we finally met in physically with all partners from Western Balkans and Europe countries.



To recall, the Intervet WB is a three-year pilot project for the internationalization of vocational education and training systems in the Western Balkans, started at the end of 2019. The project aims at creating opportunities for learning mobility in the training centers of Western Balkans and improving the culture of learning mobility in the field of VET.

The hosting partner, IUS Lifelong Learning Center (IUS Life), welcomed the participants and project partners from 8 member states of the EU and 6 Western Balkans countries. Prior to the meeting, the guests were addressed by the Rector of the International University of Sarajevo, Prof.Dr. Ahmet Yildirim, who stressed the importance of vocational education in the growth of national economies and the benefits of internationalizing mobility. Dr. Yildirim welcomed participants and invited them to the tour of the IUS campus.

In the two-day event, the partners evaluated the activities done in the previous year, partially disrupted by the Covid-19 pandemics, and reported their strengths and weaknesses. The partners shared their experience and gave suggestions on how to overcome obstacles and challenges of future mobilities and how to manage the unforeseen expenses, such as PCR tests and extremely high costs of mobility organization due to the pandemic. The meeting gave the participants a chance to finally meet in person and strengthen the already existing cooperation.



During the work in small workshops, the participants pointed out the need to adapt to the post-pandemic conditions as soon as possible and suggested a number of ideas to solve the new organizational problems. The need for better dissemination of the Intervet WB project was also emphasized as well as financial and administrative management and planning of upcoming mobilities. At the end of this two-day event, the guests were given their certificates of attendance and had a farewell photo session.

Albania participates for the first time in EuroSkills 2021

The latest edition of the EuroSkills competition will be taking place from 22nd of September until the 26th. This time the competition will be hosted in Graz, Austria.

The EuroSkills is the European Vocational Championship, which is held every two years in one of the 31 WorldSkills Europe member countries. It is a competitions where young professionals meet together to compete and to share expertise with each other.



For Albanian Skills -National Association for Skills Competitions, national skills competitions are a strong platform and voice to help raising the awareness for skills and VET system in the country, as well as the showcase of excellence of talented youngsters in professional skills.

Initiated 7 years ago as a private sector-based organization, the Albanian Skills aimed to give the Albanian young generation an opportunity to exhibit their talents and expose them to a wider audience of skills needed from the private sector. The organization sees the skills competitions as an important step of the career guidance process for young professionals thanks to the introduction of the most relevant labor market needs skills and professional standards during the implementation of the skills competitions.

Throughout the years, the skills competitions are enriched with new disciplines, providing the youngsters from 16 to 25 years old with an opportunity of competing in different fields of their interest.

Last edition in November 2020 gathered more than 150 youngsters as competitors, juries and volunteers and the organization is delighted to have hold the 6th Edition of Skills Competitions in the country though under the restrictions of the pandemics.

We are excited and can't wait to have finally the Albania Team competing and working in EuroSkills Graz 2021. The winners of the disciplines: Software Development; Web Development, Entrepreneur in Business, Photograph, Graphic Design and Hotel & Restaurant Services will go to EuroSkills Graz 2021 comprised by two teams: one competition team in the category Entrepreneurship Skills and the other is a team of volunteers to work and contribute in the workshops which close to their qualification. Albania sends the for the first time one competition team in EuroSkills while sending the team of volunteers is for the second time after the successful participation of it in EuroSkills Gothenburg 2016.

Albanian Skills takes the honor and pride to such participation because it is the organization's vision and at the same time the aspiration of the Albanian talented youngsters to have the opportunity of competing and representing their country Albania internationally. And thanks to EuroSkills organization the dream is coming true!

WHAT STUDENTS DO DURING THE SUMMER?

Throughout the school year many students anticipate the summer months, it is a time when they can relax, travel and do whatever they want. But some use this time off to do more productive things, such as taking a seasonal job, do an internship, or take a summer class In surveying various students from in Albania some conclusions can be made as for the data from the responses gathered.

Firstly, more than half of the respondents that were surveyed do in fact spend the summer time working in various jobs. The jobs range from service jobs, such as a waiter, to more technical jobs like IT or a programmer.

Another interesting information gathered was when asked if the pay they received was sufficient for their lifestyle and spending habits about half of those surveyed replied that they did not receive any sort of wage or salary. This could mean that they are working in order to gain experience or they could be taking part in some kind of unpaid internship program both of which help these students gain valuable knowledge and skills that they could use later on as they go about their professional careers.

But when asked whether the job they do currently has any connection with their schooling the results were mixed as close to half said their current employment does have connections with their current schooling but on the other end a majority replied that their current job does not have any connection with what they are learning in school. This could be the result of many factors that would have to be investigated further.

With this information gathered it helped to light up a bit on how students spend summer break, can provide some hints about seasonal youth employment in the country and think about further actions can be done. Further research is necessary to be done to gather more meaningful information and data in order to produce more qualitative findings for the policymakers, central and local governments, and to helping the young people in in Albania in various ways.

"A visit far from your future career" Project

New project kicked off thanks to US DEMMOCRACY COMMISSION GRANTS

It is a project funded by the US Embassy Program for Democracy, from July 2021-February 2022, implemented by Albanian Skills in close cooperation with three municipalities of Kukes, Mat and Diber in the Northern part of Albania. The purpose of this project is to support these three respective municipalities in empowering young people, girls and boys with the necessary skills for the labour market, promoting self-employment and entrepreneurship and business awareness for youth employment. To provide all the above services, the Center/Office for Career Information and Guidance will be opened in each of these three municipalities in close collaboration with them.

In the municipalities of Dibër, Kukës and Mat live a large number of unemployed young people or entering the labor market at a young age. Young girls and boys in these areas need a lot of encouragement, motivation and support to develop themselves and their community. Due to the lack of attention in these areas, youth development activities are not numerous. Through this initiative the project aims to equip young people with some knowledge that can serve them wherever they want to develop their professional life. Also the creation and maintenance of an active and sustainable practice of linking between businesses-youth-institutions will be with a special focus for this project.



The target group for this project are 45 young people from each municipality who are in a transitional phase of their lives such as finishing high school, graduating from university and who are looking for a job. Gender representation will be of particular importance for the activities because it is important for girls to face the labor market and have the opportunity to develop gradually, being represented up to managerial levels, in order to bridge the social gap. The target group will be achieved through cooperation with municipalities, schools and local employment offices.
